COVID-19 Relief Update

Thanks to the contribution received from generous donors like you, HelpYourNGO Foundation donated **Rs5,375/-** to PLS and provided **Dry Ration Kits** to **10 families** in **Phase V** conducted on **5th and 6th November, 2020**.

Note: HelpYourNGO has disbursed **Rs1,57,178/-** to PLS so far towards COVID-19 relief material distribution – implemented in four phases over the months of March, May, July and August 2020.

Need and Background

In light of the complete shutdown of most production related activity from March 24, 2020 due to the Covid-19 outbreak, there was bound to be a significant impact on the lives and livelihoods of daily wage earners. Based on a quick need assessment done at the ground level, PLS realized that the immediate need was of extending support to migrants and daily wage earners with food relief materials for their survival.

Along with the on-going COVID-19 pandemic, people had to face the fury of the floods which wreaked havoc in some parts of Rajasthan in August 2020.

Location

Rajasthan – Mansarovar, Jaipur

Beneficiary Selection Criteria

- Daily wage earners, families living Below Poverty Line, and migrant workers
- People who earn their livelihood as security guards, gardeners and agarbatti makers who are without work since the lockdown

Implementation Methodology

- Identification of daily wage earners and migrant workers in containment zones with the help of volunteers and the project team of PLS
- Door to door distribution of kits was done by PLS project team and volunteers
- Guidelines given to the project team to ensure safety of every team member and volunteer were strictly adhered to. Volunteers were provided with mask and gloves. Kits were distributed following social distancing practices. Proper hygiene was ensured through sanitation of premises on hourly basis.

Kit Content

Dry Ration kit - This kit was designed to suffice a family of 5 members for 10 days

Outcome so far

- 62 families received Dry Ration Kits in Phase I of distribution in March 2020
- 122 families received Dry Ration Kits in Phase II of distribution in May 2020
- 6 PPE kits were distributed to frontline workers in May 2020 of which 4 were given to police officials of Brahmapuri Station and 2 to field workers of PLS working in containment areas and carrying out relief activities
- 18 families received Dry Ration Kits in Phase III of distribution in July 2020
- 15 families received Dry Ration Kits in Phase IV of distribution in August 2020
- 10 families received Dry Ration Kits in Phase V of distribution in November 2020
